ResearchReport Length RequirementA minimum of 1500 words excluding the title page, abstract, references, and captions, with a minimum of 15 references excluding website references.

In addition, students must be sure that they include all components as indicated in the Research Project Report Grading Rubric. The Rubric can be found in CANVAS

If a student chooses to complete a Research Project, they must submit a Research Project Plan that includes theroject title, description, and research plan (together as 1 page) as agreed to by the student and the mentor along with the "Mentor Identification Form" to CANVAS at least 1 weekbefore the start of your Research RotationThis plan will be reviewed for approval by the Course Director.

Submission/Grading Process
